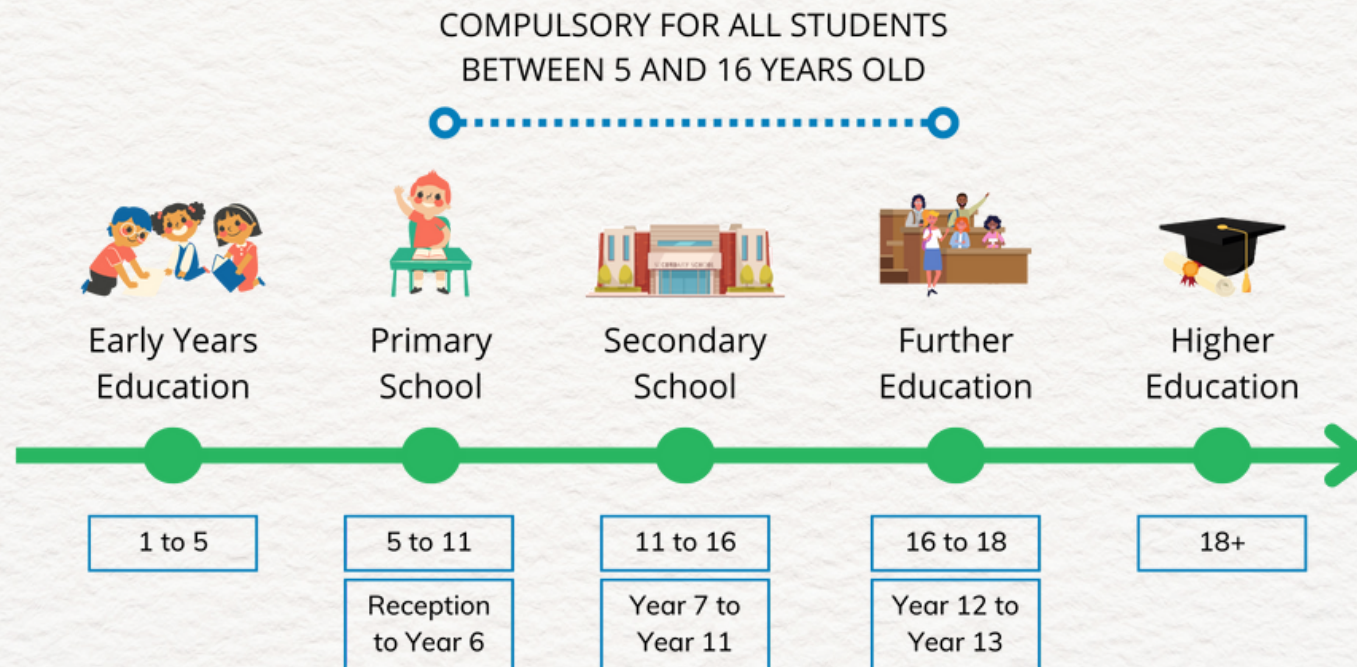


British Curriculum

In our lower school pupils follow a broad curriculum encompassing English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities and a Modern Foreign Language. Our curriculum follows the English National Curriculum in each subject offered. In addition pupils can choose to participate in a range of other subjects including a second or third language, creative writing etc.

At LEO School, we feel that it is important for parents and students to be formally updated on progress. As a result, twice a year, after Term 1 and after Term 3, students will be formally tested in their subjects and then reports will be produced.

To support pupils in their studies, the school issues pupils and parents with a list of recommended text books and resources that support the subjects taught. At the end of lower school in Year 9 pupils then select their subject choices for IGCSE.

IGCSE

(International General Certificate of Secondary Education) - Certificate of Compulsory Secondary Education.

2 Years

8 Subjects (5 core + 3 additional)

The IGCSE programme is the international equivalent of the national GCSE curriculum in a British high school.

It was created in 1988 specifically for international students planning to study abroad.

A-LEVEL

A-Level is the British high school programme. The programme lasts for two years and during this time a student can take three or more A-Levels subjects.

2 Years

3-4 Subjects

A-Levels can be studied entirely online at an international school.

Classes are taught by teachers from the UK.

Graduates receive an international school certificate.



IGCSE Course

In years 10 and 11 pupils study for International GCSEs from the Cambridge International/Edexcel Examination Boards. Pupil progress is regularly monitored and all pupils sit mock examinations in the autumn term of Year 11.

All subjects are graded on a series of final examinations that are sat at an examination centre local to the pupil.

During the course of their IGCSE studies pupils are supported through a range of careers advice activities including the use of the online careers advice service and guest speakers from a variety of professions.

Students choose around eight subjects to take GCSEs, including the compulsory Maths, English and Science subjects. The curriculum retains a personalised learning environment that encourages personal growth and self-expression. Some pupils can choose early entry in Languages and Maths. The flexible curriculum allows for this.

We are offering the following subjects for new entry at IGCSE level:

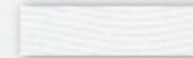

General Certificate of Education Ordinary Level (GCE O Level) results are reported on a 6-point scale of grades: A*(a*), A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d) or E(e), grade A*(a*) being the highest and grade E(e) the lowest. UNGRADED indicates a standard below that required for grade E(e).

NO RESULT indicates that a result cannot be issued because of absence for the whole or part of the examination in the syllabus or because of a decision not to issue a result for some other reason.
 PENDING indicates that a result cannot be issued at present but will follow in due course.
 TO BE ISSUED indicates that the results will be awarded in the next series.

In some IGCSE syllabuses Oral/Aural (Speaking & Listening) communication is reported separately on a 5-point numerical scale, grade 1(ONE) being the highest and grade 5(FIVE) the lowest. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard for grade 5(FIVE) will not receive an Oral/Aural (Speaking & Listening) communication endorsement. The endorsement grade for Oral/Aural (Speaking & Listening) communication will be reported on IGCSE certificates provided the overall IGCSE syllabus result is grade G(g) or higher.

For English as a Second Language 0510 and 0528 the Oral/Aural is compulsory and is reported separately. For English as a Second Language 0511 the Oral/Aural is compulsory but is not reported separately.

For First Language syllabuses and Afrikaans as a Second Language, Speaking & Listening is optional and is reported separately. For First Language English 0522 the Speaking & Listening is compulsory but is not reported separately.

The Percentage Uniform Mark for IGCSE and GCE O Level is provided in addition to the grade for a syllabus. The Percentage Uniform Mark is not the total mark achieved for the syllabus. It is a common scale for all syllabuses to show whether the candidate's performance is close to the top, bottom or middle of the grade. A Percentage Uniform Mark is not provided where the candidate's result is Ungraded, No Result, Pending or To Be Issued.

Only grades A*(a*) to G(g) achieved in IGCSE syllabuses will be reported on certificates.
 Only grades A*(a*) to E(e) achieved in GCE O Level syllabuses will be reported on certificates.

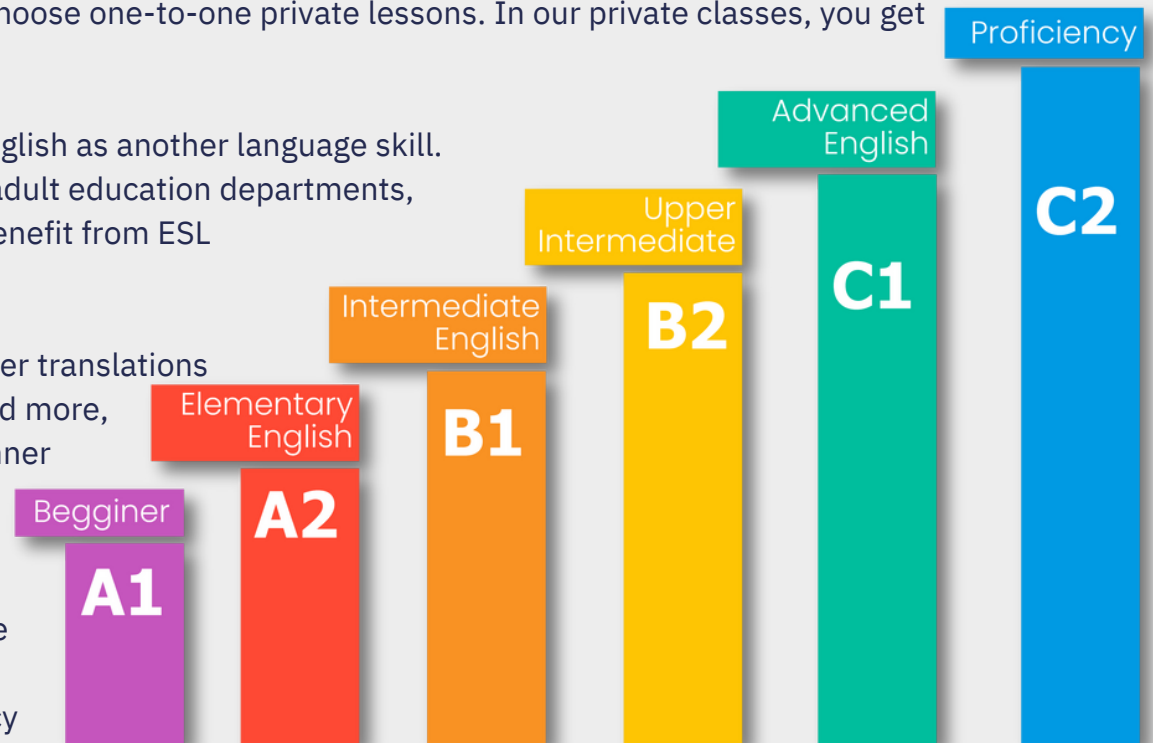

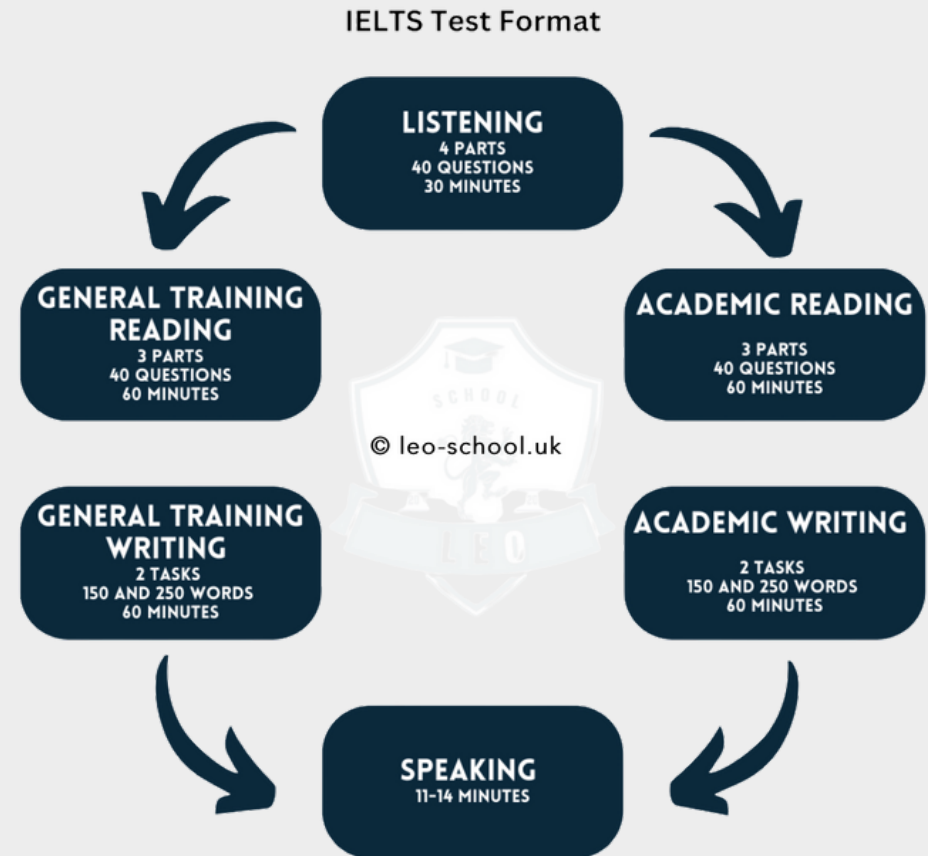

What is IELTS?

IELTS (International English Language Testing System) is an international standardised test of English proficiency for non-native English language speakers. IELTS is usually taken for study or work abroad, for immigration, for a career or just for yourself to get an accurate assessment of your language skills.

IELTS is available in two test formats:

Academic module and General Training module. The Academic format is designed for those who are going to study in English in a foreign educational institution, General - for those who go abroad for permanent residence or work and valid for two years. After that period, your language skills will need to be demonstrated again.

How it Works

Each pupil in the school has their own secure username and password which logs them into their personal school control panel. From here pupils then have access to all the functions of the school.

Pupils can check their timetable for the week, the main school notice board for updated information, look at pupil message boards and keep in touch with classmates.

At the start of the school day pupils click on their 'start lesson' to join their first lesson. This automatically places them into their class and alerts their teacher and the pastoral team register.

Once the teacher can see pupils in the class they can start the lesson.

The school timetable provides a structured day with the majority of lessons for the lower school pupils (11-16). The number of different subjects taught in any one day is kept to a minimum which allows the consolidation of what is being learnt.

At the end of each lesson the teacher sets a homework assignment.

HOW WE TEACH



All lessons are delivered in a live classroom setting by our professionally qualified teaching staff.

Our subject-based approach follows the English National Curriculum or the syllabus of the relevant examination board.



At the end of every lesson the teacher sets a homework assignment; these are completed in conjunction with the pupil's notes, the lesson recording and a range of textbooks.



Homework submission is often requested to be written rather than typed to ensure that pupils regularly practice cursive writing and ensure they are fully prepared for final examinations.

The Virtual Classroom

The classroom is divided into 3 main areas.
Each virtual classroom has a multifunctional, interactive, dynamic and vibrant platform which provides a rich teaching and learning environment.

- *Voice* -

The teacher's and pupil's names appear; everyone can hear the teacher talking as they deliver the lesson. Pupils can ask or answer questions and speak to the whole class using a microphone on their computer.

- *Text* -

Teachers and pupils can also communicate using the text area. There is public text which everyone in the class can see, but there is also a private messaging facility so that questions can be asked and answered in private.

- *Work* -

The interactive whiteboard works in the same way as any other class room whiteboard. Also Powerpoint presentations can be used to illustrate certain subjects. The teacher can use a 'follow-me' browser to take the class to a specific website. Pupils often enjoy preparing their own presentations on a topic, these can be uploaded to be viewed by the whole class.



Reporting

Our online school platform provides a comprehensive reporting suite allowing parents, pupils and teachers at any time to check on attendance, participation, homework submissions, homework grades and overall pupil progress.

Any pupil can contact the school office directly from their personal control panel with a message or query. Pupils have a number of constantly updated graphical representations charting their personal attendance and homework, and parents can login to their own control panel or contact LEO Admins at any time for specific queries.

Alongside the range of automated progress tracking measures visible through the control panel additional reports are sent out twice a year that show achievements and set targets to work on.

In addition to progress monitoring based on teacher assessment and examination performance, pupils can specify their own personal targets and pupils and teachers both contribute to evaluation records.
